CIRCLE 7 RANCH

Most CFFU members know that we have planned a special Fall River Outing this year, coming up on October 7th & 8th. We have reserved the Circle 7 Ranch located on the Fall River in Northern California for this special We are limited to sixteen people. So the first sixteen to sign up and pay will get to go. Sign-ups began at the February 1st general meeting. September does seem like it is distant right now, but we must act now.

We will be staying in the 4 houses at Circle 7 Guest Ranch on Friday Oct 7 and Sat Oct 8, 2016. We need a minimum of 16 people to secure the houses and the max is 25 people. (If we have more than 25 people, we can accommodate in other properties OFF premises...other houses or Spinner Falls Lodge owned by same company. This is an excellent trip for spouses or non anglers due to

the nice accommodations and beauty of the area. Our package will come with 2 nights lodging, a boat for 1 day (2 per boat), and a nice catered dinner at the Circle 7.

There are other fishing opportunities in the area such as McCloud River, Pit River, Baum Lake, and Hat Creek. The cost will be \$316 per person for the 2 nights, dinner, and the boat for 1 day based on 2 people. You may subtract \$50 for a non-angler and fish with someone else from the group. On the other hand, if you want to add another day of fishing on the Fall River, the lodge charges \$100 for a boat/per day which you can split with someone too. I will pair anyone who needs a boat partner. The boats are equipped with a small gas motor and an electric trolling motor as the! speed limit is 5 mph on the river. The river is beautiful and flat with no rapids...very peaceful and calm. All the houses have a nice kitchen so you can cook your own breakfast/lunch if desired. Again, we will have a group dinner Sat night.

COST: \$316 per person, (NLT 12/20/2015)

Fall River itself is some fifteen miles long with an average depth of 7 feet of icy cold water, making it impossible to wade. The entire river bank, from where the headwaters bubble out of the ground to its confluence with the Tule River is privately owned, making public access along the river difficult even though the water itself is open to the public. The Fall River is the nation's largest spring system, creating a wonderland of crystal-clear, 50-degree rainbow trout habitat. At the same time it is both the finest spring creek fly fishing opportunity in California . (per the Fly Shop)
