ITEMS TO BRING:

- a. Name badge to get free admission to the park, saving you \$5, and convenience
- b. Nippers and needle nose pliers for those of you rigging rods
- c. Polarized sunglasses, hat, sunblock, grubby clothes
- d. A large salmon net, or something equivalent (if you have one)
- e. For those of you who will be volunteering to document the event digitally, a digital camera with 2 SD cards
- f. CFFU, has gone to the trouble and expense of purchasing SF Giant-colored bright orange T-Shirts for volunteers. You are only allowed one T-Shirt, no matter how many events you volunteer for, so if you already have a t-shirt, please bring it, and wear it. For those of you who do NOT already have one, Betty and Keith Pfeifer will be taking roll from the sign-in sheet and issuing you a free t-shirt.
- g. If the weather is warm, wear appropriate clothing to layer as the morning rolls on towards noon

TIMING OF THE EVENT:

8 AM Sign-in, begin rigging rods, sorting worms, getting organized, telling lies, etc.

I will give a demonstration on:

- A great way to rig a worm on a hook (The Big Red Worm Company is donating about 60 cartons of bait, so we do not have an endless supply)
- How to cast a closed faced spinning rod - in the past, I just assumed everyone knew how to do this, silly me.

9 AM - official start time of the event, although there will be early birds wanting to check in. Volunteers from Sac County, Therapeutic Recreation Services, TRS, will be on hand to register the pre-registered participants

11:30 AM - first call to announce lunch being served by the Carmichael Kiwanians

12 noon - fishing ends and lunch service begins. CFFU members de-rig and gather rods to be bundled up

1 PM - event officially ends Event Coordinator and other volunteers take nap and begin relaxing.....
